(1) INTRODUCTION:

Nigerian Petroleum Development Company Limited (NPDC) has a requirement for the Procurement, Installation and Commissioning of 1 X 650 KVA and 1 X 500KVA Diesel Power Generators for the Field Logistics Base (FLB) at Oredo Processing Facilities, OML 111. NPDC therefore invites reputable and competent companies for the provision of the above-mentioned service for her field operations.

(2) SERVICES REQUIRED/SCOPE OF WORK:

The proposed scope(s) covers as listed but not limited to the work items listed below:

(1) PROCUREMENT

- Provision and delivery of one (1) unit of CAT 650 KYA Gas Generator
- (MOCTEL 3412. 3phase, 50 Hz, 1.500RPM).
- Provision and delivery of one (11 unit CAT 500KVA diesel generator
- Provide all enclosed documents kits and accessories including but not limited to manuals, certificates and guides.

(2) INSTALLATION AND COMMISSIONING

- Provide design for installation and programme for commissioning and testing.
 - Mobilization of qualified personnel (skilled, semi-skilled and unskilled), tools devices equipment and logistics incidental to and/or necessary for the seamless Installation of the procured generators.
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- Civil and structural works: site preparation, construction of shelter, concrete foundation/slab, mini Tools storage, surrounding drainage (with gratings cover) and access control.

 - Mechanical works: fabrication and hook-up of 4,000l capacity diesel storage tank, trenching and construction of gas supply pipe (including third party inspection/QA/QC). Provide adequate corrosion protection system.

 - Provide 3-layer anti-corrosion painting of all metal part as follows;

 - Primer and intermediate coat points shall be zinc -rich epoxy/poly amide and epoxy/aliphatic poly ethane respectively.

 - Topcoat shall be shall (or marine) green finish.

 - Provide commissioning spares.

 - Testing, commissioning, documentation, demobilisation and housekeeping (site restoration).
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- Provide two (2) hardbound hard copies and two (2) disc drive (soft) copies of detailed documentations including but not limited to wiring diagrams.
 - Project Management for the duration of all works, which includes, but is not limited to; provision of project office, accommodations, feeding, logistics, ICT facilities and other direct costs for project team and equipment required for completion of all the scope of work and the ancillary works.
 - Provision of cashes.

(3) SUSTAINABILITY

- Design and implementation of a comprehensive predictive and preventive maintenance programme covering all direct and indirect units of the power generators.
 - End user Operation and Maintenance competency/skill building programme for 10 NPDC personnel at OEM facility.
 - Perform condition based monitoring of the generators employ requisite diagnosis equipment as well as periodic analysis of maintenance logs.
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- Create and update a computerized maintenance management system to effectively document and manage the maintenance activities of the generators.
- Provide 2 years routine maintenance and maintenance spares including hand tools and equipment needed to implement them.

CONTRACT STRATEGY:

The strategy is to engage the service of a contractor to execute the services on a one-off basis for mobilization and a period of One (1) year for maintenance support subject to renewal. Following this advertisement, companies will be evaluated and ranked based on their performance. Contract shall be awarded to the lowest evaluated responsive bidder. NPDC shall retain the selected company to provide the required service during the contract duration.

(3) MANDATORY REQUIREMENTS:

To qualify for consideration and in line with the Nigerian Content Development policy, interested companies or consortia (which may comprise, both Original Equipment Manufacturers/suitable Multinationals and Nigerian/indigenous service providers) are required to Submit the following documents. Failure to submit any of the under-listed documents for each member in the case of consortia may result in the disqualification of the individual member and entire consortium.

- (1) Full details of Company profiles, including details of ownership of each alliance Member if Contractor is a consortium or alliance.
- (2) For a tendering consortium or alliance, evidence of legally binding agreements between members of the consortium (MOU), providing detailed listing of the specific set(s) of services that each member of the consortium will be primarily responsible for or assigned within the overall tender work scope.

- (3) Copy of Department of Petroleum Resources (DPR) registration certificate in relevant area.
- (4) Evidence of registration into NNPC/NPDC or any other Strategic Business Units (SBU).
- (5) Documentary evidence of incorporation as limited liability Company in appropriate jurisdiction as well as evidence of registration to conduct business in Nigeria.
- (6) Current income tax clearance certificate.
- (7) Evidence of financial capability, Company's financial details and audited accounts over the last three (3) years (audited accounts report shall be from a registered accounting firm).
- (8) Organisation structure, available manpower with a list of key professional staff with their CV. CVs shall be those of key personnel that would work on this project and who are key to the successful execution of the work, detailing educational and experience level and industry certification attained.
- (9) Provide in detail Company's Health, Safety, Environment & Security policy and management systems, including evidence of any internationally recognised accreditation (e.g. ISO certification).
- (10) Provide Security and Community relations' management proposal, giving in detail how your Company has successfully handled security and community related issues in the past and propose to do so for the said project.
- (11) Details of company QA/QC programme, including evidence of any internationally recognised accreditation (e.g. ISO 9000).
- (12) Evidence of past relevant experience and successful performance in the provision of similar services.
- (13) Any additional information that may enhance the potential of the company.

(14) To be eligible for this tender exercise, interested Companies are required to be registered with NNPC/NPDC for this category of service. Successfully pre-qualified suppliers in these categories will receive invitation to Technical Tender (ITT).

(15) To be eligible, all tenderers' must comply with the Nigerian Content requirements as contained in item 4 below.

(4) NIGERIAN CONTENT DEVELOPMENT:

As requested by the Nigerian Oil & Gas Industry Content Development Act 2010, each Contractor will be required to:

- (1) Demonstrate that the entity proposed for execution of the service is a Nigerian Registered Company, or Nigerian Registered Company as the contracting entity in genuine alliance or joint venture with foreign company with details on scope and responsibilities of parties for this work. Such companies must show evidence of joint venture binding agreement duly signed by the CEO of both companies including evidence or plans of physical operational presence and set-up in Nigeria.
- (2) International or multinational companies working through a Nigerian subsidiary must demonstrate that a minimum of 50% of equipment to be deployed for execution of the work shall be owned by the Nigerian subsidiary by providing a list of equipment for this tender and including those that will be owned by the Nigerian subsidiary.
- (3) Furnish details of company ownership and shareholding structure with photocopies of Forms CAC2 and CAC7.
- (4) Provide a Nigerian Content Plan with detailed description of the role, work scope, man-hours and responsibilities of all the Nigerian companies and personnel that will be involved in executing the work also provide details of Nigeria Content focal point or manager.
- (5) State proposed total scope of work to be conducted by Nigerian personnel (whether contracted directly or under subcontract agreements) with names and addresses including evidences of well-equipped offices and workshop.
- (6) Provide detailed plan for staff training and development.

(7) Provide detailed description of the location of in-country offices.

Interested Companies are to note that pursuant to NPDC (NNPC) and Federal Government Policy to provide opportunities for Nigerian contractors and the development of local expertise, all the applicants must comply fully with the NOGICD Act to give preference to Nigerian companies or foreign companies with Nigerian affiliate and local ownership, which demonstrate willingness to execute the project to the satisfaction of the Nigerian Content requirements and guidelines. Each applicant is enjoined to avail themselves of the requirements of the Nigerian Oil and Gas Industry Content Development (NOGICD) Act for full compliance.

Nigerian Petroleum Development Company on behalf of the Joint Venture partners is committed to fully comply with the requirements of the NOGICD Act. In maximizing the local content of this project, pre-qualifiers are requested to give full details of their strategy for the local content implementation in order to comply fully with the law.

In compliance with NOGICD Act requirements for Research & Development therefore, the following should be noted;

(1) All Operators or project promoters in the Oil and Gas industry launching service contracts or other applicable projects with completion period of 12 months and above shall provide R&D implementation arrangement with at least one applicable R&D cluster approved by the Board as part of the operator's Nigerian Content Plan for the project or service. The arrangement shall be in the form of a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) and indicate how the Operator will deploy the Cluster for any R&D requirements during the contract phase and the first five years of the service life of the field, facility or plant.

(2) All Operators are to include in their ITT documents, a requirement that any service company bidding for such a project shall submit as part of Nigerian Content requirement, a signed MOA between it and one of the R&D Clusters relevant to the project. All service companies are required to sign an MOA with any of the research Clusters. The MOA shall indicate how the service company intends to use the relevant research Clusters during project execution to the satisfaction of the Board. The MOA shall form part of the documents to be reviewed at technical evaluation stage.
