Invitation to Tender for the Provision and Management of Bandwidth to Some Universities Where the Unlcc Project Has Been Implemented

(1) **Background**

The USPF has a national mandate to provide strategic investments in national ICT projects geared at providing unserved, underserved and rural communities access to Information and Communication Technology (ICT), As part of the mandate, the USPF has over the years implemented projects and provided grants to enable access to basic ICT- enabled learning tools in several institutions across the country under its various projects and programmes such as the University Inter-Campus Connectivity (UnICC) project. The UnICC Project is designed to seamlessly connect the networks of the main campuses of selected universities to the networks of their teaching hospitals/medical colleges across the country through the deployment of Optical Fibre Cable (OFC) and its associated equipment

However, to sustain this project and to ensure that its impact is realized by the beneficiaries, the USPF seeks to provide additional support in form of bandwidth connectivity. Funds have therefore been appropriated to provide bandwidth connectivity to complement those obtained from other sources at Universities that have been identified as unserved or underserved.

(2) **Objectives**

The main objective of the bandwidth provision is for the provider to facilitate, supply and manage internet bandwidth for UnICC project in each of the Universities listed in this advert.

(4) **Scope Of the Project**

(a) Survey and conduct site assessment to determine the equipment and associated peripherals to be replaced or provided in all the Universities in the lot or lots under consideration,

(b) Provide DS-3 (45Mbit's) IP Connection to the Universities Data Centre from where it will be distributed internally oath to the University and its corresponding Teaching Hospital via the OFC and associated equipment provided under the UnICC Project

(c) Provide all the. necessary lost mile Microwave Radio link, hardware, tools etc., and undertake the integration of the University Data Centre to the nearest PoP of the internet Provider (primary internet connection which must come via fibre optic connection)

(d) Provide 1 year post implementation maintenances and support

(5) **Deliverables**

(a) Submit a comprehensive completion report of internet bandwidth provisioning in all Universities in the lot or lots with graphic presentation of internet usage per

University per lot. The report should indicate equipment provided or replaced in all the Universities, bandwidth utilisation chart etc.

(b) Submission of IP addresses, names of contact persons and GPS co-ordinates of each University

(c) Submit quarterly post implementation report detailing all the relevant statistics in the preceding period e.g, availability, usage, etc, in addition to maintenance work undertaken, equipment repaired or replaced etc.,

(d) Submit final project report covering the entire contract duration

(6) Eligibility Criteria

(a) General Conditions

Eligible companies must submit the following;-

(i) Evidence of Incorporation and or registration with Corporate Affairs Commission. Companies must enclose Certificate of Incorporation and Form CO7.

(ii) Articles and Memorandum of Association, of their Company, which must show that the Company has ICT related activities as part of it objectives.

(iii) Three year Tax Clearance certificates (2012.2013 and 2014).

(iv) Evidence of Value Added Tax (VAT) registration certificate and past remittances.

(v) Audited accounts for the last three years.

(vi) Evidence of registration on the database of Contractors, Consultants and Service Providers by inclusion of the Interim Registration Report (IRR) issued by BPP is included in the requirements in line with the provision of Section 5 (h) of the PPA, 2007.

(vii) Verifiable evidence of financial capacity to execute the project, and such evidence must come from a reputable bank.

(viii) Evidence showing a proper understanding of ICT data solutions large networks,

(ix) Evidence of similar works carried out in the past.

(x) Company profile and organizational structure, including names, certificates and resume of key personnel and technical staff with addresses and phone numbers.

(xi) Current Pension Clearance Certificate from PENCOM including evidence of remittances

(xii) Evidence of Compliance Certificate with Industrial training Fund (ITF) Act No, 19 of 2011,

(xiii) Evidence of compliance with the Employee's Compensation Act. which stipulates a remittance of 1% of the total annual emolument of workers to. NSITF.

(xiv) A sworn affidavit that the firm is not bankrupt, in receivership or under liquidation or involved in my litigation which can potentially affect the company's ability to conclusively participate in this engagement.

(b) **Specific Conditions:**

The proponent shall be required to demonstrate the following minimum competencies

(i) Proponent must have a verifiable NOC in its premises for similar assignments carried out in the past

- (ii) An understanding of the ICT industry in Nigeria or worldwide,
- (iii) Experience in bandwidth supply.
- (iv) Experience in internet service delivery.
- (v) Experience in OFC instillation.

(vi) Proponents must demonstrate the ability use not less than 25% of local content in the implementation of this project

(vii) Demonstrate evidence of similar assignments carried out in the past
