(2.0) Scope:

The assignment will cover the following, among others:

(1) Provision of leased Submarine Fiber Optic Circuits from Lekki in Lagos State to Qua Iboe Oil Terminal in Akwa Ibom State with high capacity bandwidth (minimum of STM-2) capable of transmitting multi-customer (different oil companies) bandwidthintensive data, voice and video traffic, Internet service inclusion is optional.

(2) Installation of branching nodes from the main Submarine Optic Fiber trunk to offshore locations along the route. Some nodes will branch to nearby onshore locations with Last Miles provided between provider's onshore Point of Presence and customers' business premises (Coordinates to be provided by participating Oil Companies)
