1.0 Introduction

4.0 Nigerian Content Requirements

Vendors are to demonstrate strict compliance with the provisions of Nigerian Oil & Gas Industry Content Development Act and also provide the following requirements:

- (1) Demonstrate that the entity is a Nigerian Registered Company, or Nigerian Registered Company as the contracting entity in genuine alliance or joint venture with foreign company with details on scope and responsibilities of parties for this work. Such companies must show evidence of joint venture binding agreement duly signed by the CEO of both companies including evidence or plans of physical operational presence and set-up in Nigeria
- (2) Only Nigerian indigenous service company having 51% and above Nigerian equity shareholding in the ownership structure of the legal registered entity of tenderer in Nigeria

and duly registered on the NCDMB NOGIC JQS as service providers under the applicable and relevant product category shall be allowed to bid for this work.

- (3) Nigerian Indigenous company executing the work scope in alliance with foreign companies and multinational should ensure that;
- (a) the foreign company or multinational is duly registered in Nigeria
- (b) submit CAC forms C02 and C07 of the both companies
- (c) submit binding memorandum of agreement (MOA) stating the following:
- (i) The Nigerian Indigenous company will be the lead of the partnership
- (ii) The detailed scope of work to be performed by each party
- (iii) Detailed personnel and equipment that each party will deploy to execute the work scope
- (iv) The MOA will be governed by the laws of the Federal Republic of Nigeria
- (v) The MOA to be signed by the Managing Directors of both companies.
- (4) International or multinational company working through a Nigerian subsidiary must
- (a) demonstrate that the Nigerian subsidiary has 51% and above Nigerian equity shareholding in the ownership structure of the legal registered entity of tenderer in Nigeria and duly registered on the NCDMB NOGIC JQS as service providers under the applicable and relevant product category and
- (b) demonstrate that a minimum of 50% of equipment to be deployed for execution of work shall be owned by the Nigerian subsidiary by providing a list of equipment for this tender and indicating those that will be owned by the Nigerian subsidiary
- (5) Furnish details of company ownership and share holding structure. Also submit clear photocopies of your CAC Forms C02 and C07

- (6) Provide evidence of what percentage of your key management positions is held by Nigerians and what percentage of the total work force are Nigerians. Also, show overall percentage of work to be performed in Nigeria and those by Nigerian resources relative to total work volume.
- (7) Provide a Nigerian Content Plan providing a detailed description of the role, work scope, man-hours and responsibilities of all Nigerian companies and personnel that would be involved in executing the work. Also provide details of Nigerian Content focal point or manager.
- (8) State proposed total scope of work to be conducted by Nigerian personnel (whether contracted directly or under subcontract agreements) with names and addresses including evidences of well equipped offices; attach past experience of such patronage.
- (9) Specific to this work, provide detailed plan for staff training and development on equipment repairs & maintenance and procurement (including all software to be used, number of personnel, name of organization providing such training and evidence of past training record) for Nigerian personnel including description of any specific programs in place for transfer of technology and skills to indigenous businesses and Nigerians over the next five (5) years.
- (10) Location of in-country facilities (Storage, workshops, repair & maintenance facilities and testing facilities)
- (11) Contractor must be willing and able to provide evidence of maximization of made in Nigeria goods and services.
