(1) To be eligible for this tender exercise, interested contractors are required to be prequalified as essential service vendors in the 1.10.08 -Process Control and Monitoring Equipment and Systems (Product/Services) category (A-D) in NipeX Joint Qualification System (NJQS) data base. Only successfully pre-qualified suppliers in this category will receive Invitation to Technical Tender (ITT).

(2) To be eligible for this tender exercise, interested contractors should also be registered on the NCDMB NOGIC JQS in the relevant product category

(4.0) Nigerian Content Requirements

Vendors are to demonstrate strict compliance with the provisions of Nigerian Oil & Gas Industry Content Development Act and-will be expected to meet the following requirements at the Technical and Commercial tendering phase;

Demonstrate that the entity is a Nigerian indigenous registered company with 51% and above Nigerian Equity shareholding in the legal registered entity of tenderer in Nigeria and registered on the NCDMB NOGIC JQS in the relevant product category.

Tenderers shall provide evidence of agency agreement with the OEM or parent company guaranty or Binding memorandum of agreement with OEM representatives in-country for all software and hardware to be used in executing the work scope

Nigerian Indigenous company executing the work scope in alliance with foreign companies and multinational should ensure that:

(i) The Nigerian Indigenous company will be the lead of the partnership

- (ii) The detailed scope of work to be performed by each party
- (iii) Detailed personnel and equipment that each party will deploy to execute the work scope
- (iv) The MOA will be governed by the laws of the Federal Republic of Nigeria
- (v) The MOA to be signed by the Managing Directors of both Companies.
- (a) The foreign company or multinational is duly registered in Nigeria
- (b) Submit CAC forms CO2 and CO7 of the both companies
- (c) Submit binding Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) stating the following:

International or multinational company working through a Nigerian Subsidiary must:

(a) Demonstrate that the Nigerian subsidiary has 51% and above Nigerian equity shareholding in the ownership structure of the legal registered entity of tenderer in Nigeria and duly registered on the NCDMB NOGIC JQS as service providers under the applicable and relevant product category and

(b) Demonstrate that a minimum of 50% of equipment to be deployed for execution of work shall be owned by the Nigerian Subsidiary by providing a list of equipment for this tender and indicating those that will be owned by the Nigerian subsidiary.

- Furnish details of company ownership and shareholding structure. Also submit clear photocopies of your CAC Forms CO2 and CO7
- Provide evidence of what percentage of your key management positions is held by Nigerians and what percentage of the total Work force are Nigerians. Also, show overall percentage of work to be performed in Nigeria and those by Nigerian resources relative to total work volume.
- Provide a Nigerian Content Plan showing a detailed description of the role, Work Scope manhour and responsibilities of all Nigerian companies and personnel that would be involved in executing the work. Also provide details of Nigerian Content focal point or manager.
- State proposed total scope of work to be conducted by Nigerian personnel (whether contracted directly or under subcontract agreements) With names and addresses including evidences of well-equipped offices and workshop; attach past experience of such patronage.
- Specific to this work, provide detailed plan for staff training and development (including all
 software to be used, number of personnel, name of organisation providing such training and
 evidence of post training record) for Nigerian personnel including description of any specific
 programs In place for transfer of technology and skills to indigenous businesses and Nigerians
 over the next five (5) years.

- Contractor must be willing and able to provide evidence of maximization of made in Nigeria goods **and** Services.
- Provide details on any other Nigerian Content initiative your company is involved in.
- Provide evidence of Nigerian Content Equipment Certificate (NCEC) from Nigerian Content Development & Monitoring Board (NCDMB) or evidence of the application of the certificates
- In line with Research & Development Guidelines All operators or project promoters in the Oil and Gas industry launching service contracts or other applicable projects with completion period of 12 months and above shall provide R&D duster approved by the Board as port of the operator's Nigerian Content plan for the project

(a) The Arrangement shall be in the form of on MOA and indicate how the operator will deploy the cluster for any R&D requirements during the contract period and the first 2 years of the service life of the field, facility or plant.

(b) All service companies are required to sign a MOA with the relevant research clusters. The MOA shall indicate how the service company intends to use the relevant research clusters during project execution to the satisfaction of the Board. Researchers that meet the technical requirements of the Board shall be notified on the Research Cluster they belong to: and they will be required to upload research proposals relevant to their cluster unto the NOGIC JQS portal (<u>http://www.nogicigs.com</u>) on request.

- All tenderer to submit Human Capital Development (NCD) training in line with the NCDMB HCD Guideline 2014.
- Provide detailed description of the location and evidence of ownership (certificate of ownership, lease agreement, layout drawings and photographs) of in-country committed facilities & infrastructure (assets, equipment, technical office, and administrative space, storage, workshop, assembly area, repair & maintenance, testing, laboratory, etc) in Nigeria to support this contract or submit a credible and verifiable plan towards setting-up or leasing such facilities.
- For any key personnel position to be occupied by expatriate, submit verifiable evidence of expatriate quota approval or NOGIC expatriate biometric system card approved by NCDMB.
- For key personnel who will execute work Scope and/or services to be provided by subcontractors, submit binding memorandum of agreement with organization providing such personnel and service.
