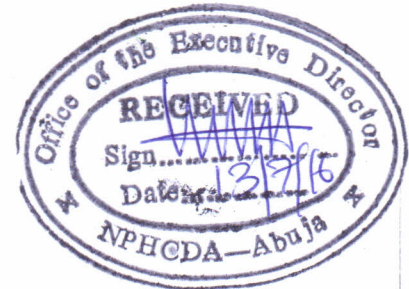

UPDATE REQUIRED ON THE PRIMARY HEALTHCARE CENTRE IN ZUMA 1, BWARI LOCAL GOVERNMENT COUNCIL, FEDERAL CAPITAL TERRITORY CONSTRUCTED BY ZAZ PROJECT LTD IN 2014.

On behalf of Public and Private Development Centre (PPDC) I write to remind you of our letter dated 10th May, and 6th June, 2016 on the above subject matter.

We write to bring to your attention the observation made by our team of procurement monitors who visited the above referenced project site on the 22nd of April 2016. We noticed that the Primary Healthcare Centre (PHC), which was completed sometime in 2014 with the sum of N21,986,893.95 (Twenty-One Million, Nine hundred and Eighty Six Thousand, Eight Hundred and Ninety-Three Naira and Ninety Five Kobo Only) is **NOT FUNCTIONAL**.

A Primary Health Care is designed/designated as the first contact level to alleviate some of the problem of inaccessibility to health care products and services, but this is not the case here as residents in Zuma Community still have to travel as far as Bwari General Hospital to receive care, and this is of great concern to us.

Please find attached a picture of the current state of the PHC.

Consequently, we kindly request that your Agency give us an update (in writing) reasons why the above stated Primary Health Care is not functional more than one year after completion.
